


# Children, adolescent and young adult services

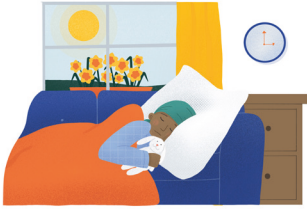
## Irish Cancer Society Parent peer support

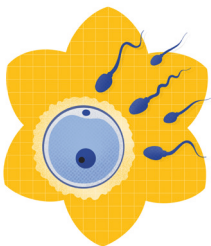

## Irish Cancer Society Patient Travel and Financial Grants

- Our **Volunteer Driver Service** brings children and young adults travelling from Kildare, Meath, Dublin and Wicklow to CHI at Crumlin for treatment.
- Our **Children's Fund** is a once-off grant of up to €3,000 for families of children undergoing cancer treatment nationwide.
- Our **Travel2Care Fund** supports patients travelling over 50 kilometres one-way to a designated centre.
